Why do we set homework at Oakmoor?

At Oakmoor, we believe homework provides an additional opportunity for students to strengthen their learning and improve their chances of success. Homework is an essential part of learning because it helps students revisit, practise and consolidate the knowledge taught in lessons.

Our homework model helps students remember what they have learned in lessons. Regular practice helps important knowledge stay in their memory for longer and prepares them for future learning, tests and exams.

We encourage students to complete homework little and often across the week rather than leaving it until the deadline. Spacing practice in this way is far more effective than cramming and helps students remember knowledge for longer.

The habits students develop in Year 7 are particularly important. Homework gradually increases in complexity as students move through the school, so establishing strong routines from the beginning will help students become independent learners and achieve the very best outcomes possible in assessments, examinations and beyond.

The knowledge and habits developed through homework in Year 7 provide the foundation for strong results in assessments, GCSE examinations and beyond.

Homework and platforms used

Parents and Carers are encouraged to check homework platforms weekly and support students in establishing a regular homework routine.

Transition booklets	These booklets have been carefully written in collaboration with our Key Stage 2 colleagues. By using these booklets your child will have an opportunity to revisit the key knowledge they need in Year 7. These booklets will be used in class in September, with the opportunity to finish each section as homework, according to the schedule outlined below.
Microsoft Teams	This is where each homework is recorded and any additional instructions are provided. Your child will be shown how to access Microsoft Teams during September. Parents can access homework information by logging into Microsoft Teams through their child's account. We encourage parents to regularly review homework alongside their child and support them in planning and prioritising tasks according to the deadlines provided.
<u>Sparx learning</u> Sparx Reader Sparx Maths Sparx Science	Sparx Learning provides personalised homework in Reading, Maths and Science. The platform adapts to your child's needs, helping them practise key knowledge and skills while providing Teachers with information about progress and areas requiring support.
Art homework	Art homework is introduced to help students develop their cultural knowledge and understanding while improving their fine motor skills, which are so important throughout secondary school.
Carousel	Carousel Learning uses regular low-stakes quizzes and flashcards to help students recall knowledge from memory, a proven strategy called retrieval practice. By revisiting key learning over time, students strengthen their long-term memory, build confidence and improve their understanding of the curriculum. Teachers use the results to provide feedback and identify any gaps in learning.

Year 7 Homework: A gradual introduction

Homework builds gradually throughout Year 7.

We start our homework journey with the transition booklet. During each focus week, students should complete only the sections of the transition booklet linked to the named subjects. No additional transition activities for other subjects are expected that week.

By week four students will be introduced to Sparx Reader, then additional homework types. By the spring term, students will be confident using all of our homework platforms and managing a wide range of subjects.

* Computer Science is only set for Year 7 and 8 assessments and will end on 16 April 2027 for Year 7

Transition books, lessons and homework

Students should bring their transition booklets into school.

Each week we have selected a small number of focus subjects. Teachers will review the work completed for those subjects, and students should then complete the relevant sections of the booklet at home.

For example, during the week beginning 14 September 2026, the focus subjects will be Art, History and Modern Foreign Languages (MFL).

We recognise that students will have completed different amounts of work before joining Oakmoor, as primary schools provide varying levels of time and support for transition activities. This is not a concern. All students will have opportunities to complete, improve and revisit their work during the autumn term.

Teachers will celebrate the quality of work completed, effort shown and engagement with the activities. The focus is on establishing positive learning habits and preparing students for a successful start to secondary school.

No detentions will be issued for incomplete transition booklet activities while students are settling into Year 7 and becoming familiar with homework expectations. Homework detentions will begin from October once all core homework platforms have been introduced.

When is homework set and due for each subject

Homework is set and due according to the schedule below.

From October, students who miss a homework deadline will attend an after-school homework detention where staff will support them to complete the missing work and establish positive homework routines.

Homework detentions explained

If a student does not submit their homework by the deadline, they will be issued a **40-minute homework detention with the relevant subject teacher**.

For example, if a student misses a Science homework deadline, they will be assigned a **40-minute Science homework detention**.

If a student does not attend this detention, they will be issued a **Science twilight detention**. Twilight detentions run from **3:05pm to 4:15pm**.

Our priority is to help students develop successful homework habits and provide support when difficulties arise.

Homework detentions provide an opportunity for staff to identify any difficulties early and offer help where needed.

For this reason, we strongly encourage students to **start homework well before the deadline**, allowing time to seek support if they encounter any challenges.
